<b>Curriculum/approach description</b>	<p>The mission of the Institute is to offer geographic, spatial, regional, spatial and urban development and planning knowledge needed for both the education and planning practice and also for research, to explore and manage the features of spatial and regional systems and operation in spatial studies, futures studies, geostrategy and ecology sciences. Its focus is on planning and strategy building in public policies, particularly in urban-regional (and other spatial) and development policy fields. This is based on a multi- and interdisciplinary scientific approach that is built on cooperation.</p> <p>The core staff of our Institute consist of high level experts of public planning (former head of department of Spatial Development Planning of Ministry for Economy, the chief planner of the governmental national planning agency, a former and the current vice-presidents of the Hungarian Society for Urban Planning, coordinator of drafting team of the Territorial Agenda of the EU 2020, etc..</p> <p>The programme is specialised on spatial planning and is characterised by interactive and out-of-class practical lessons, project-type team works, international dimensions with an emphasis on global connections. 120 credits can be acquired in total in this programme. The most important courses are of the following areas: regional economic and social geography, regional economics and policies, spatial planning, strategic planning, programming and evaluating, social planning and development, geographical information systems (GIS), development policy and spatial development, various subjects of urban studies, sustainability and climate change in policies, advanced environmental economics, sustainable and socially responsible corporation.</p>
