Curriculum/approach description	<p>The programme was introduced in 2010, as the only independent planning education programme in the country. It is offered as full-time, six-semester programme in Czech language, at the Faculty of Environment of the Czech University of Life Sciences in Prague.</p> <p>The profile of the graduates</p> <p>The graduates are prepared to work in planning departments of local and regional government. For that aim, they are prepared to undergo the Special Ability Exam for Town and Country Planning organised by the Ministry of Interior. The graduation also entitles to apply for the accreditation of the Czech Chamber of Architects for the branch of town and country planning, as a “congenial education”. Most graduates follow up to the master-degree study of Spatial Planning.</p> <p>The study programme</p> <p>The programme follows the requirement of the Czech Chamber of Architects for minimum 33% of project contact hours in the curriculum.</p>

Curriculum/approach description	<p>The programme was introduced in 2016, as the follow-up planning education for the graduates from the bachelor study of the Town and Country Planning programme but also for graduates from other programmes, namely geography, building engineering, economics and public administration. It is offered as full-time, four-semester programme in Czech language, at the Faculty of Environment of the Czech University of Life Sciences in Prague. The programme is delivered as three specialisations: Sustainable Urban Planning (U), Regional Planning (R), and Landscape Planning (K).</p> <p>The profile of the graduates</p> <p>The graduates are prepared to work as planners in government and self-government offices as well as in private plan-making businesses. The graduation also entitles to apply for the accreditation of the Czech Chamber of Architects for the branch of town and country planning, as a “full value education” (pending).</p> <p>The study programme</p> <p>The curriculum contains requisite courses, studios / projects with individual assignments and requisite optional courses following the three branches. The programme follows the requirement of the Czech Chamber of Architects for minimum 33% of project contact hours in the curriculum. An internship at a planning department is another part of the curriculum.</p>

Landscape Planning is an accredited master´s degree programme required for practice of landscape engineering and design in the Czech Republic, the EU and applicable to international locations as well. The two-year study programme consists of required courses and research-based field studies. Course work includes: landscape ecology, landscape architecture, spatial planning, land management, landscape history, ArcGIS, aquatic ecosystems, soils and erosion control, and land reclamation.
