#### Curriculum/approach description

Since September 2010, the School of Architecture has begun to teach the undergraduate courses in compliance with the new European Credit Transfer System (ECTS), also known as the Bologna Plan. Within the new studies program, the DUyOT offers 4 compulsory courses for all undergraduate students which represent 24 ECTS. Additionally, the DUyOT offers several optional undergraduate courses related to urban design and planning issues, which add up 24 ECTS to the student's curriculum. Nearly 1.800 students take every year our undergraduate courses.
