**Curriculum/approach
description**

The Master "Urbanisme et Aménagement" is a two years master programme run conjointly with the School of Architecture (ENSAG). Students can choose between 4 specialities: "Urbanisme & Projet Urbain" (Planning and Urban Project), "Design Urbain" (Urban Design), "Urbanisme & Cooperation Internationale" (Planning & International Cooperation) and "International Cooperation in Urban Planning". Two of these masters can be done under the statute of apprentice, a unique system that allow students to have a wage while studying. One of these masters is given in English (International Cooperation in Urban Planning) and is part of an Erasmus mundus programme.

Mundus Urbano (MU) is an interdisciplinary Master of Science programme specialising in International Cooperation and Urban Development, jointly offered by four European universities. It addresses the dynamic challenges faced throughout the world due to rapid urbanisation processes. Mundus Urbano produces advanced graduates who can innovatively address the complexities of the phenomena facing the world's urban populations, mostly in developing countries.

After a first year at TU Darmstadt, the consortium structure of the program allows students to pursue a double degree in International Cooperation and Urban Development with specialisations

Master of Sciences in "International Cooperation and Urban Development" in Development Economics (Rome), Sustainable Emergency Architecture (Barcelona) or Urban Planning (Grenoble).
