Curriculum/approach description	<p>The current master urbanism and spatial planning (120 ETCS) offers an academic curriculum for planners and designer with a professional orientation towards planning professions. Graduates are employed in the public sector, consultancy firms, and academic research.</p> <p>Our pragmatic interdisciplinary approach is oriented to planning processes and realization. This is informed by societal expectations on planning and by recent insights about planning in strategic planning theory, and multi-stakeholder process- and projectmanagement. Our masterprogamme allows for a part-time subscription, to provide the opportunity to combine the courses with employment.</p> <p>The competence-based programme is built around 4 lines including: context, process, design and research.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The context line teaches knowledge on the societal, ecological and political context in which planning processes are taking place in order to stimulate a self-reflexive and critical attitude - The process line teaches knowledge, skills and attitudes to design and develop multi-stakeholder policy processes aimed at producing spatial visions and to implement these visions through strategic projects. - The design line teaches knowledge, skills and attitudes do design and develop design proposals, where "design" is seen as a broad activity oriented to produce visions and spatial policy - The research line teaches traditional scientific research methods and strategies and design methods (including research by design) <p>Because of the academization process and the integration in the University of Antwerp in 2013 our programme is currently under reform. Although the 4 teaching lines will be remained, many of the old courses will be clustered into new courses in order to strengthen the internal consistence of the program and the academic character.</p>
