The students are exercised to explore and understand how our built environment is functioning and to prepare proposals for transformations of cities and landscapes. Through analogue and digital technique the students are exercised to present their proposals with text and illustrations in an attractive way. The programme has very good contacts with professional life and several of the courses are based on real cases in cities and municipalities round about the country. Professional architects and planners are visiting lecturers and supervisors in several courses. Bachelor's degree in spatial planning is part of Sweden's architecture educations. Future positions after graduation are for instance to become a planning architect in a municipality or other public authority or as a member of the staff at a consulting architect and planning agency. 	Sustainable Urban Planning
	The programme focuses on two central themes of urban planning and design of the built environment in Sweden: from post-war urban planning up until the 1980s, and sustainable urban planning from early 1990s up until today. There is a great interest in Swedish experiences of urban planning during these two periods of time. The programme in spatial planning has good cooperation with various universities in Europe and China and provides students with knowledge of Swedish experiences of urban planning. These experiences are highlighted by the various courses in the programme, where they are contextualized and problemized with the objective of developing amongst the students a reflective and critical perspective on planning and sustainable urban development in Sweden. Students are also supposed to put their newly acquired knowledge into practice in various projects and assignments. By integrating theory in the design of urban environment on different levels, the programme aims to provide students with an advanced insight and understanding of the context and complexity of Swedish urban planning.

Curriculum/approach description

Master of Science in Spatial Planning with an emphasis on Urban Design in China and Europe, 120 ECTS credit points.

Professions dealing with town planning, city development and urban design are increasingly working on an international scene. Spatial planners, landscape architects and urbanists can participate in design projects on several continents simultaneously. The great design projects encompass people from various professions and different countries. Thus evolves a notion that experience and knowledge is no longer developed within a national context. A deeper inter-cultural understanding seems necessary. Professional work within the subjects of town planning, city development and urban design is increasingly complex and demands a multidisciplinary attitude. Migration, move ability, integration issues and climate change are examples of the complex challenges posed. The joint Master's programme at BTH and Nanjing Forestry University, College of Landscape Architecture (NFU) strives to address the issues that meet a contemporary design profession. Through the cooperation between BTH and NFU, the view on public space in different cultures is studied.

The education emanates from the design professions where focus is on action and intervention meeting an academic, critical analysis. The result of this interaction is tangible proposals for change of public space and common environment. During the courses, practically oriented design tasks are intertwined with tutoring in studios or at a site. Lectures and seminars are running in parallel with project work. Courses in the range of 3 to 15 European Credits are finalized with a Diploma work of 30 ECTS.

The MSc programme in Urban Design is a professional education. The student's knowledge deepens by training in successively more complex urban design tasks. The main field of study is Spatial Planning. Basic approaches to planning processes and design methods are applied on the public space with ever more complex functions and demands.

Curriculum/approach description

The programme starts from an attitude aimed at understanding and application to complex planning processes with many different participants at different planning levels, and to deepen knowledge and capacity to make strategic planning. The courses in the programme sandwich theoretical views with practical applications focusing general planning from local to boundless international planning. The education is problem based and in the courses the general starting point is theoretical issues applicable to different planning projects. Throughout the programme the ability to critical examinations, problem identification and analysis is exercised. Furthermore practical skills are exercised through proposals and valuations of proposals and designations of consequences due to different choices, with effects for spatial organization and design. The aim is also, from a critical view, to deepen knowledge of conditions for sustainable development in society.

The programme starts from problem based studies aimed at develop skills in realizing complex projects, starting in understanding of the possibilities and limitations of spatial planning and design of built environment. The courses in the programme sandwich theoretical views with practical explorations focusing detailed planning and design of cities, landscapes and built environment. The education is carried on in studios where the student starts from a given theme or scenario and formulates an issue of one's own. From different theoretical and methodological attitudes the issue is studied and will from analytical methods and design tools result in final proposals. Further specialized courses are also included in the programme. These courses deal with for example infrastructure, mobility and technical systems from a sustainable perspective, issues of project- and process leading and urban theoretical perspectives of cities, city life and city development.
