Curriculum/approach description	<p>The Degree aims at educating and to form professionals which are deeply engaged into the changes which are transforming cities and towns, regions and landscapes, so to become able to intervene with the conceptual and operational tools of planning.</p> <p>There is a growing attention for the linkages with the economic, socio-political and administrative dimension of urban and territorial phenomena, which are part of the Bachelor courses. The course provides a specific competence on Information Systems, intended as fundamental tools for monitoring, control and govern the territorial changes, and particularly for the Public Administrations. Students are expected to learn to build a GIS, for the diverse and specific aims of planning, and to manage it.</p> <p>Another focus is on developing a communicative capacity, which is considered as fundamental for answering to the needs of a progressively more complex and differentiated society.</p>

	<p>Basically, the PhD Programme aims to offer an extensive research training directed towards the culture of territorial sustainable transformation (from an environmental, economical and social perspective), with an increasing awareness for the urban and territorial complex reality. Researchers should be able to critically gather all the multidimensional nexus of the territorial government processes. This training attempts to avoid the threats of excessive sectoral knowledge, conferring specific competences as well as the aptitude of updating them or outlining new ones in an open and international framework. The PhD Programme aspires to promote an advanced education that can be spent not only in the academic context, but also in public and private research institutes or in high-level professions both in the public and private sectors.</p>
