<b>Curriculum/approach description</b>	The obligatory base programme (48 ECTS) consists of two base modules (24 ECTS each) that are common for all the curricula of sciences. The narrow field programme comprises one obligatory narrow field module (24 ECTS) and one obligatory speciality module (24 ECTS); a student may select the additional narrow field module (24 ECTS) and speciality module (24 ECTS) from amongst the narrow field modules of sciences or the other curricula of the University of Tartu. Three selective modules (18 ECTS each) may be selected according to specialisation from amongst the elective modules of the curricula of sciences or the other curricula of the University of Tartu. The curriculum also contains optional subjects (6-12 ECTS) and a final thesis (12 ECTS).

The volume of PhD study is 240 ECTS, of which PhD study makes up 60 ECTS and PhD research 180 ECTS. PhD study consists of speciality subjects (36 ECTS), University-wide elective subjects (12 ECTS), practice learning in teaching at university level (6 ECTS) and optional subjects (6 ECTS). In conducting their research, PhD students are advised by the supervisor or the supervisor and co-supervisor(s) approved by the Council of the Faculty. PhD students' progress in research is evaluated once each academic year by an Evaluation Board.
